Mother's Day Memory Game

This game can be done with all the mothers of a family (mothers, grandmothers, great-grandmothers). Have each mother set up a list of things they remember their mother doing throughout their life. When the list is done, have each one of the mothers pick one thing from the list and act it out. This game is a great way to celebrate why each mother and child feel how much their mom means to them.

Any age group can play this game.

Mother's Day Pictures from the Past

If it's possible, get some pictures of your mother from when she was younger. Set them all out on a table and try to guess what she was for or when at what age she did what she did. The pictures will give more insight into what your mother has done in her life and why certain events were important to her. This is a wonderful experience to be able to take a look back into your mom's past. These pictures can be hand-held pictures or you could make a game of digital pictures for everyone to do.

Any age group can play this game.

Mother's Day Quiz

This is a fun game that puts the children on the hot seat and the mothers in a position of power! Have each mother ask one of their children a question about herself. For example, she might ask them "What's my favorite color?", "What is my favorite movie?", etc. This game will give the children an opportunity to show their mom how well they

actually know her! The mom and child that gets the most answers right wins so make sure the kids do their homework before you invite them to play this game at your party.

Any age group can play this game.

Mother's Day Guess Which Mom Game

I hope you are good at imitating. Have each child or help them make a list of all famous moms (politicians, actresses, actors in their mom's favorite sitcoms, moms in the Bible, etc.). Have the child pick a popular line or imitate actions that each one of those moms do and have their mom try to guess which mom they are referring to. The mom who guesses the most right wins the game.

Children age approximately 5 and up.

Mothers are Important

Have the moms in your office bring their children to the office party to be part of her special celebration and to play games.

Ask the children to write down little words on a piece of copy paper or draw pictures to show why their mothers are important, especially their particular mother. This will teach the children the value of what it means to be a mother and also give their special mom a keepsake to keep.


